

'A coach's plea to parents" taken from the Globe and Mail (contributed by Alison Belbin—edited for space). This may ring true for some of you. It helps highlight some of the struggles we all go through to provide the

best environment possible for the players to enjoy the game. To all of you who sacrifice your time and effort ... Thank You!

Tam here, on time. My mortgage is late; my oldest child is suffering through trouble at school; my youngest child begged me not to leave, and my husband and I haven't looked each other in the eye for days. But none of this matters now. I am here, on the field with your child, and mine.

Your daughter is funny, kind and thoughtful. And tonight she had a great practice. She struggled with a new skill and shook off a solid smack to her ear from a ball. We laughed She also told me something that has been bothering her, asking shyly that I not tell any-

We celebrate together and we all feel the same sting of defeat when the bounce of the ball is not in our favour. We step on the field with the best intentions. We try.

In the time it takes me to drive home and microwave my dinner, you have hastily typed an e-mail. My youngest has fallen asleep and

I sit at the table alone, reading how you feel I've let your child down. It's a shame, I think, that you missed the girls hugging and cheering each other on tonight while you were at the coffee shop around the corner.

If we win, I'll read that it's because the more talented girls got too much playing time; that I'm too competitive. If we lose, it's because I played the developing players too much; I'm not pushing them hard enough.

I know what you've told her about me and I know what you've said about her teammates. And yet, your daughter and I both keep showing up. We keep trying.

I may not do it the way you would. I may not speak to your daughter the way you would, but she needs more than one voice in her head.

I am not a professional. I am a parent who loves the game and has the desire to pass that on. I accepted the role I was offered; not for a paycheque, not for status, certainly not for praise. I accepted this role because I have been where your daughter is now. I also had coaches who believed in me, just as I believe in your

I learned early on that my coach was neither my parent nor my friend. I admired them and sought their praise. I hated them sometimes, too. If I thought I deserved a higher standing on that team, it was up to me to earn it. On her team, she is finding her identity and her place among her peers. Let her discover this, on her

Let her play.

# From the desk of Executive Director, Keith Liddiard...

The KYSA has been chosen to host the 2018 Girls Provincial B Cup finals! The event is to be held July 5-8. The Provincial B Cup is open to select teams in the U13 to U18 age groups. The tournament will bring together

eight qualifiers in each division. KYSA teams re-

ceive an automatic entry into the final rounds (as KYSA is the host).

Kamloops-resident Sophia Seibel has been selected to join the Women's Regional EXCEL Centre (REX), an elite program that is part of the Canada Soccer Pathway and supported by the Vancouver Whitecaps FC, BC Soccer and Canada Soccer. Seibel is the first player from Kamloops' Whitecaps Academy and the TOFC to be selected to the women's residency program. The aim of the program

is to develop high-level women's soccer players who can one day compete with Canada's national team. Meanwhile, Alesandro Comita has become the second Kamloops player to be selected to join the Whitecaps' pre-residency program. However, he has chosen not to accept the invitation at this time. Alesandro is just the second player from Kamloops' Whitecaps Academy and TOFC to be identified as a candidate for the program. Wil Calne was the first last year.
